The service de police de Saguenay (SPS) has established a long-term partnership with the Centre d'amitié autochtone in Chicoutimi. More than 1,500 community members live in the regional metropolis, a number that is expected to increase. These members come mainly for easier access to health services, education and employment.

The SPS provides various services under this partnership, including prevention and the assistance of a liaison officer to help with emergency interventions.

This rich partnership will help build bridges in an effort to promote Indigenous awareness.
